

## BREAST CANCER AWARENESS MONTH



TIPS

- 1. KNOW YOUR RISK**
  - Talk to both sides of your family to learn about your **family health history**.
  - Talk to a doctor about your risk of breast cancer.
- 2. GET SCREENED**
  - Talk with a doctor about which screening tests are right for you if you are at **higher risk**.
  - Have a **mammogram** every year starting at age 40 if you are at average risk.
  - Have a **clinical breast exam** at least every 3 years starting at age 25, and every year starting at age 40.
- 3. KNOW WHAT IS NORMAL FOR YOU**  
See a doctor if you notice any of these **breast changes**:
  - Lump, hard knot or thickening inside the breast or underarm area
  - Swelling, warmth, redness or darkening of the breast
  - Change in the size or shape of the breast
- 4. MAKE HEALTHY LIFESTYLE CHOICES**
  - Maintain a **healthy weight**.
  - Make **exercise** part of your routine.
  - Limit **alcohol** intake.
  - **Breastfeed** if you can.

## CLEAN WATER STARTS WITH YOU



### Streets Connect to Lakes and Rivers

Rain water flows to storm sewers that connect to area lakes and rivers. Along the way, stormwater runoff collects litter, nutrients, and salt (pollutants) from lawns, sidewalks and streets. Eventually, that polluted water flows to our waterways.



#### How Can You Help?

- Everyone can help prevent pollution
- Rake leaves and remove debris from the street in front of your house
  - After mowing, sweep up grass clippings from streets, driveways and sidewalks
  - Use a rain barrel to collect and use rain water
  - Redirect your gutter downspouts from driveways or alleys onto lawn or garden areas
  - Pick up pet waste
  - Prevent fluid leaks by keeping your vehicle in good repair
  - Never pour anything down a storm drain
  - Plant a rain garden



# FIRE PREVENTION



### Smoke Alarms

Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, inside bedrooms and outside sleeping areas.



### Turn Off Gas Tanks When Not in Use

To avoid a terrible accident, close your liquefied petroleum gas (LPG) after every use.



### Check the manufacturer's date of your smoke alarms.

If they're 10 years or older, they likely need to be replaced because components such as batteries can become less reliable. Follow your alarm's manufacturer instructions.



### Get a Fire Extinguisher

Installing a fire extinguisher at home or in the office doesn't directly prevent a fire, but it can surely help stop it from spreading.



### Escape Plan

Include at least two ways to exit every room in your home in your escape plan.



### Get Insurance

With fire insurance, you protect yourself financially from the aftermath of a fire. You won't have to deplete your savings or emergency fund in case your property gets damaged or destroyed.

## 5 WAYS TO PAY

- 01 Pay Online!**  
Customers who choose this method will need their Utility account number which is listed on your utility bill. These types of payments will reflect on the account immediately once the transaction is completed.
- 02 Pay By Phone: 972-218-1328**  
Representatives are available Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. These types of payments are real time and the account updates once the transaction is complete. Customers may also pay their bill at any time by utilizing the automated phone payment system.
- 03 Kiosk**  
There is a Kiosk located on the east side of City Hall at 211 N. Henry St. for Utility payments. The Kiosk accepts checks, money orders, credit cards, and cash (no change). The payments are real time and the account updates once the transaction is complete.
- 04 Pay in Person**  
You can make a payment in person for your water bill at the Utility Billing office inside City Hall located at 211 N. Henry Street. Also available to customers is a utility bill drop off box located near the east entrance of City Hall.
- 05 Pay By Mail**

### REQUIREMENTS FOR SERVICE

- Heartworm prevention can only be prescribed after the pet receives a negative heartworm test administered by TCAP.

- All dogs must be on a tight leash for the safety of your pet and other clients and their pets.

# Bulky Waste & Brush

Bulky waste will be collected every other month, according to the schedule below.

1 cubic yard is equivalent to approximately one washing machine.



You are limited to 12 cubic yards of bulky waste and brush per collection.

Tree limbs must be placed with trunks parallel to the street without obstructing the sidewalk. Individual items or bundles must weigh less than 50 pounds, and be no longer than 10 feet.


Place all bulk and brush items at your curb no later than 7:00 a.m. on the Monday of your service week.

## Bulky Waste - Acceptable

- Toys and Yard Tools Tagged as "Bulk Item"
- Furniture
- Bundled Carpet in 4-foot Lengths
- Fence Panels No Larger than 4'x6'
- Thorny Vines Must be Bagged or in Containers
- Bagged Leaves (10 Bag Limit)
- Washing Machines, Dryers, Water Heaters and Kitchen Appliances
- Refrigerators/Freezers  
(Must be tagged certifying removal of refrigerants)

## Bulky Waste - Prohibited

- Commercial Remodeling/Construction Debris
- Household Hazardous Waste
- Tires, Batteries, and Propane Tanks
- Loose Household Debris  
(Debris must be placed in a box or other container no larger than 2'x2'x4' and weighing no more than 50 pounds.)




# REGULAR TRASH & RECYCLING COLLECTION



## TRASH & RECYCLE

Regular trash and recycle trash are collected ONCE a week. Lancaster is divided into five (5) areas and the day your regular trash is picked up depends on what area you live in. You can [view an interactive map](#) that will assist you in determining what day of the week your regular trash is scheduled for collection on our city website.

[Interactive Maps](#) can be found at [www.lancaster-tx.com](http://www.lancaster-tx.com) under the "Interactive Maps" button.



Regular trash is picked up *weekly* in the City of Lancaster. The GRAY trash carts are designated for regular trash. The BLUE carts are for recycling.

For residents with alleys, the trash and recycling carts are picked up in the rear of the home if not blocked by obstructions.

1. For efficient driver retrieval, place both trash (gray) and recycle (blue) carts with handles towards the curb.
2. Set carts out by 7:00 a.m. on the day of service.
3. Household trash should be in disposable bags inside 95-gallon trash carts.
4. All items **MUST** be placed in carts with the lids fully closed for pickup.
5. Carts must be 3 feet away from each other, 5 feet away from any obstacles: such as mailboxes, cars, fences, gas meters or drainage ditches and a 16-foot clearance above the cart.

**The 50/50 Sidewalk Program provides owners of residential property occupying their home with an opportunity to replace defective sidewalks in front of their parcels for half of the total cost. For non-resident property owners not occupying the home, the city manages 40% of the cost.**

**Sidewalks that qualify are typically rated as fair to poor. Sidewalks in good condition will not qualify for the program.**

## PROGRAM STEPS:

- 1 Reach out to the city to join the Cost Share program.**  
*(If funds are unavailable, you'll be added to the list for the following year. When funds are available, you'll receive a letter asking if you still wish to participate.)*
- 2 If confirmed by resident to participate, city staff will assess your sidewalk repair needs.**  
*(You'll receive a cost share quote, a sketch of the repair area, and a 30-day payment deadline.)*
- 3 A contract will be prepared with the property owner and the city completes the work, which comes with a one-year warranty.**

## VOLUNTEER WITH THE LANCASTER EYES AND EARS PROGRAM (L.E.E.P.)

### LANCASTER EYES & EARS PROGRAM

#### **Lancaster Eyes and Ears Program (LEEP)**

The City of Lancaster Code Compliance Division is seeking volunteers to join the Lancaster Eyes and Ears program (LEEP)

The LEEP program will primarily perform duties in the field identifying code violations for code officers to perform further investigation. The program is intended to have volunteers aid city staff in improving and preserving the quality of life in our community. LEEP volunteers will help act as the "eyes and ears" in residential and commercial neighborhoods to staff code compliance officers. Citizens are key to identifying potentially serious problems.

#### **Essential duties and responsibilities:**

Patrol assigned areas to identify code violations such as:

- Excessive accumulation of trash and debris;
- Parking of vehicles, boats, trailers on unimproved surfaces;
- High grass and overgrown weeds/vegetation;
- Junk vehicles;
- Illegal dumping and litter; and
- Illegal placement of signs

LEEP volunteers will be asked to take photos of the identified violation and submit with the address to the code compliance division. The volunteers would only be able to provide limited information to property owners and residents concerning the correction of violations, bulk trash pickup procedures, and adhere to the expectation of privacy and personal safety.

#### **Qualifications:**

Volunteers are requested to volunteer a minimum of 4 hours per week. Work schedules are flexible based on your availability but are limited to daytime hours. Volunteers must possess a Texas class "C" driver's license, successfully complete a background check and drug test, reside in the City of Lancaster.

#### **Training:**

The basic training includes, reviewing the relevant municipal code sections, criteria for determining if the conditions and known facts constitute an actual violation and how to work cooperatively with people to avoid confrontation and be a good ambassador for the city. The overall goal is to target, the problem not the people.



Training will include a total of five, 2 hour sessions with code officers to educate volunteers on different code violations that may occur in the field. The training session will include 1 hour inside and 1 hour in the field with a code officer. Volunteers will be trained on what violations are and what they may look like in the field as well as procedures of reporting to code office.
