Happy 2012!

As we embark on a New Year, we reflect on the changes our community has experienced. At a time when cities across the country are facing economic difficulties, we have been managing the challenges and are seeing positive growth in our community.

During the past year Council adopted a balanced budget that resulted in no tax increase to our citizens. There were moderate increases in our water and sewer rates. This additional revenue will be utilized for a new elevated water storage tank and line infrastructure improvements throughout the community to address mandates required by state law. Evidence of the strength of our local economy includes; Standard & Poors and Moody's upgrading our credit rating to A2 and Aa3 respectively. In the last year, three major commercial corporations have located in our community adding over 200 new jobs and occupying nearly 1,000,000 sq. ft. of warehouse space. Three national restaurant chains will now call Lancaster home. Logan's Roadhouse opened in Fall 2011. In N Out Burger and Chicken Express are scheduled to open during the first quarter of this year.

In addition to the water infrastructure improvements, Houston School Road has been reconstructed or overlaid from our northern city limits at Wheatland Road to our southern city limits at Bear Creek Road. We completed approximately \$829,776 in street improvements during 2011. Additional streets pavement and reconstruction will continue as weather permits.

We have much to look forward to in 2012. While we still have some challenges ahead, we continue to strive diligently to provide quality service to the citizens of Lancaster.

The Lancaster Connection offers an opportunity to provide information regarding the many programs and quality of life services available through our Parks, Recreation and Library Departments. While this is a quarterly publication, we invite you to "Like" us on Facebook or sign up to receive our weekly email blast, Lancaster Live Around Town. Municipal Election May 12, 2012



A municipal election for the City of Lancaster will be held on May 12, 2012 for the election of: **Mayor.**

The first business day you may file for a place on the ballot is Monday, February 6, 2012. The deadline for filing for a place on the ballot is Monday, March 5, 2012 at 5:00 p.m. at the City Secretary's office located at 211 N. Henry Street.

To qualify for the office of Mayor, a candidate must:

- be a United States citizen;
- be 18 years of age or older on the first day of the term to be filled at the election;
- have not been determined by a final judgment of a court exercising probate jurisdiction to be (A) totally mentally incapacitated; or (B) partially mentally incapacitated without the right to vote;
- have not been finally convicted of a felony from which the person has not been pardoned or otherwise released from the resulting disabilities;
- be a qualified voter of the City including the newly annexed Sunrise District; and
- have resided in the City of Lancaster, Texas, including the newly annexed Sunrise District, for a period of one year prior to the date of the municipal election.

In addition to the application for a place on the ballot and the Declaration of Residency forms, the City's Home Rule Charter requires the candidate to obtain, on a petition form, 25 valid signatures of qualified voters in the City (including the newly annexed Sunrise District) where you are seeking office. The term of office for mayor or a councilmember is three years.

A candidate's packet is available to help acquaint you with applicable requirements to run for office in the City's municipal election. The candidate's packet provides guidelines and forms to file for a place on the ballot, as well as a Campaign Finance Guide and other helpful information regarding the May 12, 2012 municipal election.

Obtaining a candidate's packet is not a requirement for filing for a place on the ballot. Applicable forms are available on the Secretary of State website at www.sos.state.tx.us/elections and the Texas Ethics Commission website at www.ethics.state.tx.us. The Declaration of Residency form is available from the City Secretary's office. Picking up a candidate's packet does not indicate an application for candidacy has or will be filed.

Candidate's packets are available from the City Secretary's office, at City Hall, 211 N. Henry Street, Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

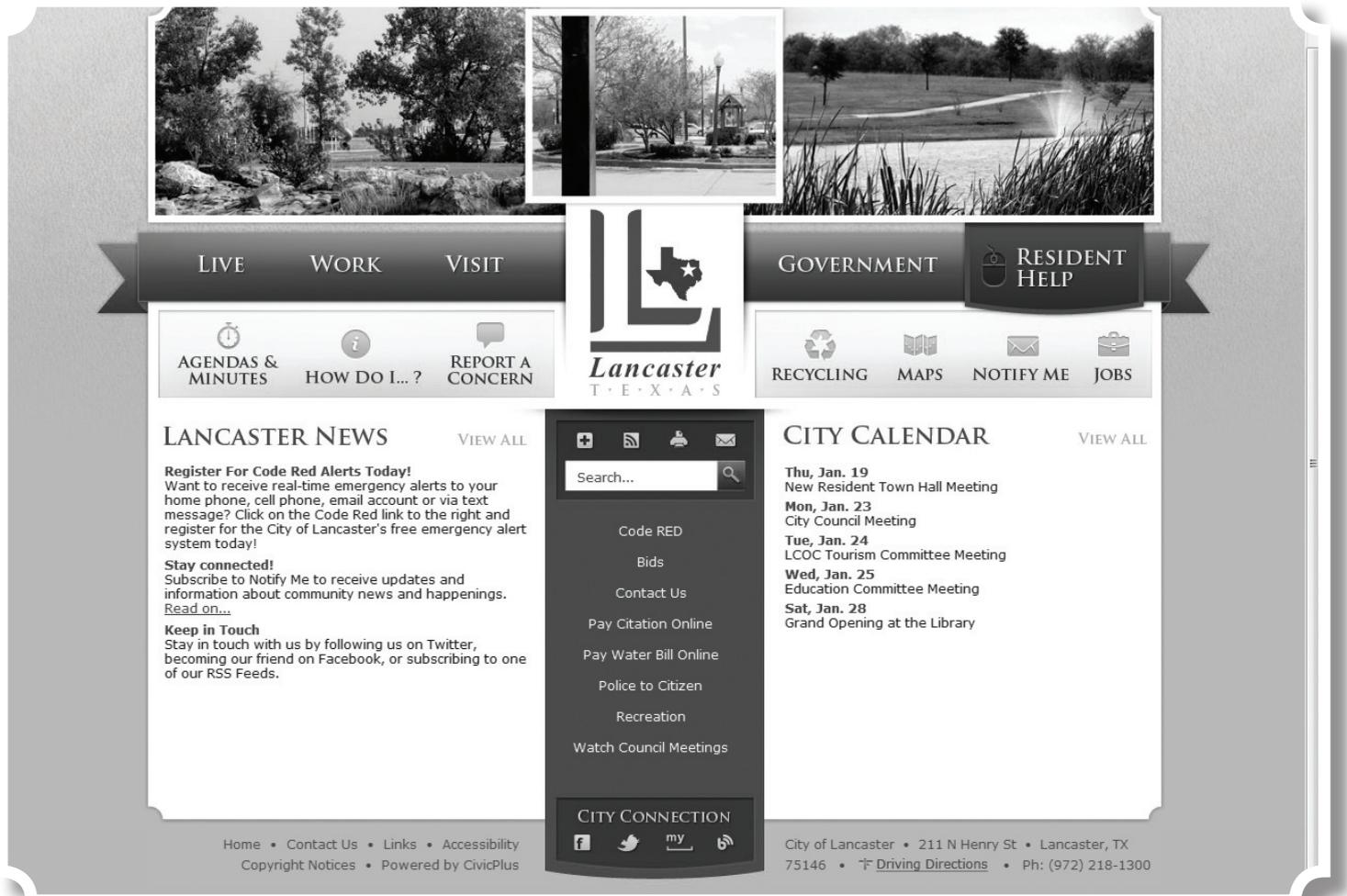
Mayor outlined the benefits of marrying the visions of the Lancaster Independent School District and the City of Lancaster through communication and partnership.

Here in the City of Lancaster, snow, sleet and ice can be a rare occasion to come by, but we all know it does happen a few days of the year. Driving in these conditions can lead to slower traffic, hazardous road conditions, hot tempers and unforeseen dangers. To help you make it safely through these conditions, here are some suggestions from the National Safety Council to make sure that you and your vehicle are prepared.

Weather

At any temperature weather affects roads and driving conditions and can pose serious problems. It is important to monitor forecasts on the web, radio, TV, cable weather channel or in the daily papers.

Your Car

Prepare your car for winter. Start with a checkup that includes:

- Checking the ignition, brakes, wiring, hoses and fan belts
- Changing and adjusting the spark plugs
- Checking the air, fuel and emission filters, and the PCV valve
- Inspecting the distributor
- Checking the battery
- Checking the tires for air, sidewall wear and tread depth
- Checking antifreeze levels and the freeze line



Your car should have a tune-up (check the owner's manual for the recommended interval) to ensure better gas mileage, quicker starts and faster response on pick-up and passing power.

Necessary Equipment

An emergency situation on the road can arise at any time and you must be prepared. In addition to making sure you have the tune-up, a full tank of gas, and fresh anti-freeze, you should carry the following items in your trunk:

- Properly inflated spare tire, wheel wrench and tripod-type jack
- Shovel
- Jumper cables
- Tow and tire chains
- Bag of salt or cat litter
- Tool kit

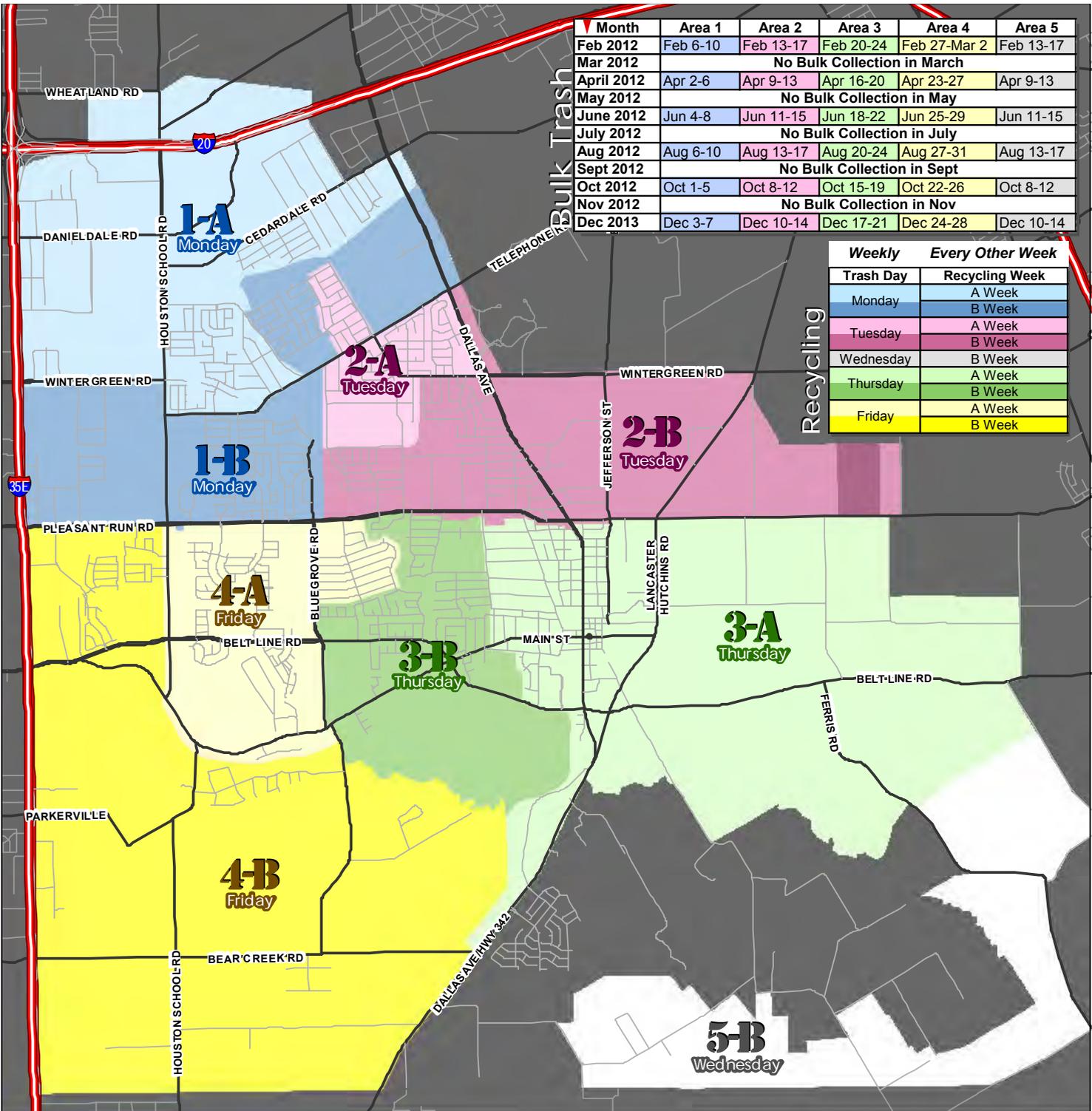
Essential Supplies

Be prepared with a "survival kit" that should always remain in the car. Replenish after use.

Essential supplies include:

- Working flashlight and extra batteries
- Reflective triangles and brightly-colored cloth
- First aid kit
- Exterior windshield cleaner
- Ice scraper and snow brush
- Wooden stick matches in a waterproof container
- Scissors and string/cord
- Non-perishable, high-energy foods like unsalted canned nuts, dried fruits, and hard candy.

In addition, if you are driving long distances under cold, snowy, and icy conditions, you should also carry supplies to keep you warm such as heavy woolen mittens, socks, a cap and blankets.

Bulk trash is placed at the street **BEFORE 7:00 am MONDAY** of your week. Do not add to the pile during the week. You may start putting trash out Saturday & Sunday before your pick up week. The trash hauler has until Friday to complete service. You are allowed only 12 cubic yards of bulk trash. Early or late setouts will be tagged for immediate removal and are subject to removal charges and/or fines. No liquids, hazardous waste, construction debris, electronics or automotive waste. All refrigerants from appliances must be removed and certified.

Recycling & Solid Waste Tips

Your recycling day is the same as your trash day every other week. Place your recycling cart out with your trash no later than 7:00 a.m. on your recycle week (A or B). Do not use your recycle cart for regular trash as it will not be picked up or weighed for points.

Are there items that should not be placed in my recycle cart?

Plastic toys, dishes, bowls, buckets, plastic wrap, grocery bags, plastic sleeves or trash bags. No styrofoam or lacquered plastics of any kind, pizza boxes, window glass, auto glass, mirrors, light bulbs, dishes, china, ceramics, medical waste, needles, syringes, aluminum foil, plastic take out food containers, washboard, baby diapers, or paper towels.

MANDATORY Drought Contingency Plan STAGE 2

Mandatory Stage 2 Watering Restrictions begin Monday, December 12, 2011.

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?

STAGE 2 WATERING SCHEDULE - Lancaster Drought Contingency Plan

Last Digit of Address

Watering Days Allowed

0, 2, 4, 6, or 8 (even numbers)

Sundays and Thursdays

1, 3, 5, 7 or 9 (odd numbers)

Saturdays and Wednesdays

For more detailed information regarding the Mandatory Stage 2 Watering Restrictions, please visit www.lancster-tx.com or www.savedallaswater.com or contact the City of Lancaster Public Works Department at (972) 218-2324.

- Restrict operation of ornamental fountains or ponds to initial filling except where necessary to support aquatic life or where such fountains or ponds are equipped with a recirculation system.
- Prohibit hosing off paved areas, buildings, windows or other surfaces.
- Encourage further reduction in frequency of draining and refilling swimming pools.
- Prohibit recreational water use including use of faucets, hoses or sprinklers which use water in such a manner as to allow run-off or other wastes.
- Restrict washing of any motor vehicle, motorbike, boat, trailer, airplane or other vehicle to the use of a hand-held bucket or a hand-held hose equipped with a positive shutoff nozzle for quick rinses. Vehicle washing may be done at any time on the immediate premises of a commercial car wash or commercial service station. Further, such washing may be exempted from these regulations if the health, safety and welfare of the public is contingent upon frequent vehicle cleansing, such as garbage trucks and vehicles used to transport food or perishables.
- Requires reduction of water use through the mandatory day-of-week landscape watering schedule and requires watering only during off-peak hours. Irrigation of landscaped areas with hose-end sprinklers or automatic irrigations systems shall be limited to 2-days-per-week. Irrigation of landscaped areas is further limited to the hours of 12:00 midnight to 10:00 a.m. and between 6:00 p.m. to 12:00 midnight on designated watering days. Apartments, office building complexes or other property containing multiple addresses may be identified by the lowest address number. Irrigation of landscaped areas is permitted at any time if it is by means of a hand-held hose, a faucet filled bucket or drip irrigation system.

PLEASE DON'T FEED THE STORM DRAIN

When pet waste, motor oil, fertilizers and other chemicals wash down a storm drain, they flow into rivers and lakes contaminating drinking water sources. It's called "Nonpoint Source Pollution."

What can we do to prevent this type of pollution? Follow these easy steps!

YARD

- Don't overfertilize.
- Sweep (do not wash) fertilizer and soil off driveways and walkways.

CAR

- Maintain your car to prevent oil leaks and recycle used motor oil.

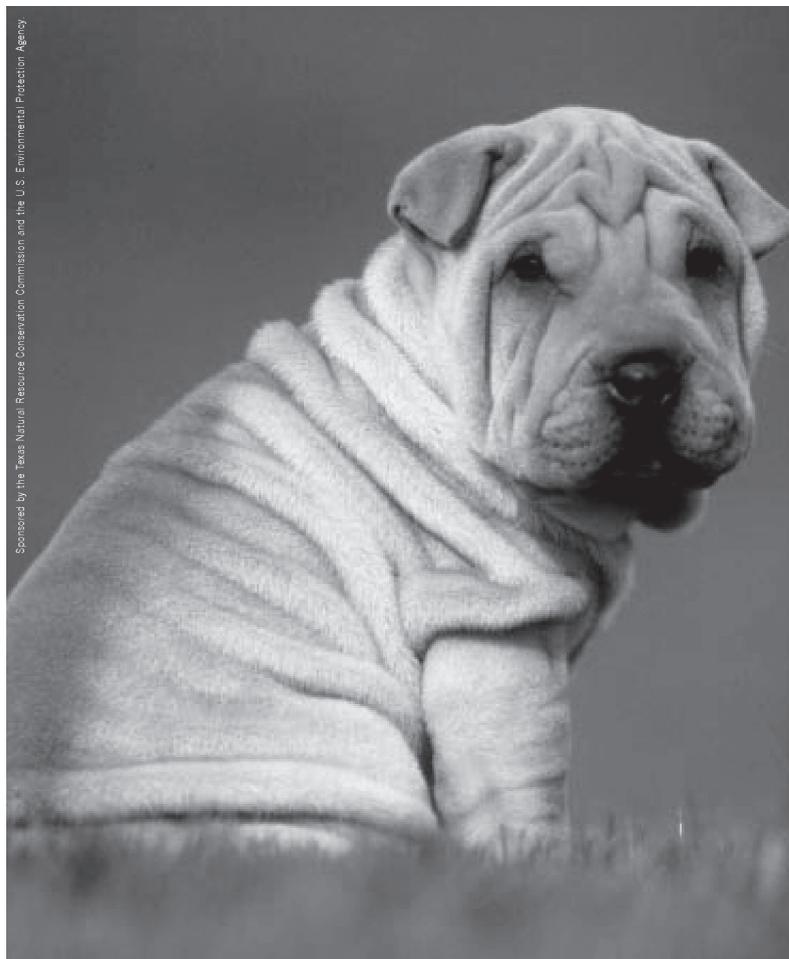
PET

- Pick up pet waste from yards, trails and sidewalks.

HOME

- Use nontoxic or natural household cleaning products.
- Recycle or properly dispose of household chemicals.

STREETLIGHT OUTAGES

Lighting the way for drivers and pedestrians, streetlights are vital to our everyday lives. The sooner we know they are out, the sooner we can get them fixed!

Don't forget safety! We appreciate your help, but it is important that you do not put yourself in harm's way when noting street light outages. Pull over safely when recording the location of a streetlight outage.

Please follow the numbered steps below to report an outage.

1. In the "Address" box, enter the approximate street address of the light, always being sure to include city name and then click "Go" to take you to the location and display the lights in the area. The arrows +/- in the upper left corner of the map can be used to move around the map to a different location and then click on "Show Lights" to display the lights in the new area.

2. The address you entered will be marked by a yellow balloon. Oncor street lights will be shown in red. (Blue balloons denote Guard lights which must be reported to the Retail Electric Provider.)

3. After balloons appear, click on the red balloon indicating the affected Oncor light. Once selected, the balloon will change from red to black. The "Location #" box on the right side of the page will automatically be filled.

4. Enter your name and contact information.

5. Check the box indicating whether you'd like to be notified about the repair by e-mail or phone. E-mail is the quickest way to receive confirmation.

6. Check the box(es) indicating the issue(s) affecting the light you've selected.

7. Type in any additional information not covered by the check boxes in number 6, such as "bird's nest in fixture."

8. Click the "Submit Report" button. Do not hit the "Back" button while page loads. A screen will appear confirming your report and providing a tracking number for future reference.

Q: Where is the Housing Authority?

A: The City of Lancaster Housing Authority is located at 1425 N. Dallas Ave (Regions Bank) on the 1st floor.

Q: When is my bulk trash day?

A: Bulk trash is determined by the area you are in and the normal day your trash is picked up. Bulk trash is picked up every other month and must be out on the front curb by Monday at 7:00 a.m. of your designated bulk trash week. For more information see page 8.

Q: Do I need an garage sale permit?

A: A permit is required for garage sales and they can be obtained at the Development Services office located at 700 E. Main St. A driver's license or other proof of Lancaster address where the garage sale will take place is required.

Q: Do I need an alarm permit?

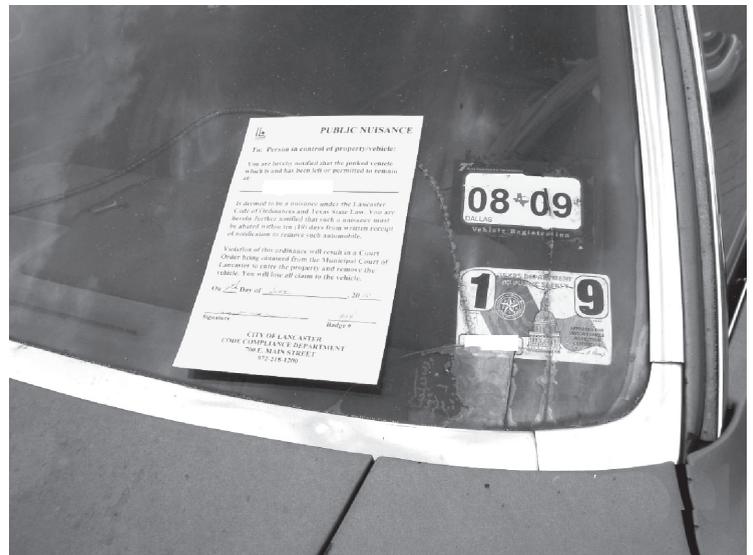
A: Yes, you are required to obtain an alarm permit from the City of Lancaster Police Department. An application may be found on our website or you may call (972) 218-2700.

Q: When are City Council Meetings?

A: City Council Meetings are held every 2nd and 4th Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers at City Hall. Check out www.lancaster-tx.com to view the City-Wide calendar.

INOPERABLE VEHICLES

Vehicles within Lancaster City Limits must have current vehicle registration and current inspection tags to be on your property in public view or in the street. Vehicles that have flat tires, are wrecked or inoperable need to be repaired or removed from public view by being parked inside your garage. Vehicles without current registration and inspection are subject to removal and/or a citation being issued by Code Compliance. For registration information visit www.texasonline.state.tx.us or your local Texas Department of Transportation Department.



OVERHANGING LIMBS

Time to get those trees into shape. Trees, shrubs and other vegetation should not block a public sidewalk or hang any lower than 7 feet over the sidewalk. Limbs should not hang lower than 14 feet over a street or alley. Keeping your limbs to a minimum of 14' over the street will help keep our City fire trucks and trash service vehicles from being damaged when passing by. Most fire trucks are between 11-14 feet in height. Damage to the top and/or sides of these vehicles can be quite expensive. Take advantage of your FREE bulk pickup service by trimming the weekend prior to your week of bulk pickup.



BULK TRASH

Please remember to check your bulk trash schedules before placing your bulk out for pickup. Items placed out at the wrong time are subject to a three day notice to remove and fees related to removal if still there after three day notice. Call 972-218-1300 if you have questions about the pick up dates for your address.
