

Be Proactive to Reduce Fire-Related Injury and Death

Are you doing enough to prevent a home fire?

Despite a recent study revealing that 97 percent of households have installed smoke alarms, home fires continue to be the third leading cause of unintentional injury-related deaths.

“The fact that fire and burns continue to be a leading cause of home injury death is a clear sign that Americans need to take a more proactive role in their own safety,” said Meri-K Appy, president of the Home Safety Council.

How do you reduce fire-related injuries?

The Home Safety Council suggests a two-pronged approach: install and test smoke alarms, and then create a fire escape plan for your household.

“If you don’t have working smoke alarms on every level of your home and a well rehearsed fire escape plan, you are exposing your entire household to an increased risk of fire and fire injury.”

Installing and Testing Smoke Alarms:



Install smoke alarms on every level of your home, including the basement and in or near all sleeping areas.



Test smoke alarms at least once a month, as well as upon return from an extended vacation or trip. Replace batteries at least once a year. Never disable smoke alarms; even temporarily – you may forget to replace the battery.



Smoke alarms don’t last forever; replace once every ten years.



Consider installing an automatic home fire sprinkling system. While smoke alarms provide early warning of the fire, sprinklers immediately suppress and even extinguish the fire, often before the fire department arrives.



For the best detection and notification protection, install both ionization and photoelectric-type smoke alarms. Some models provide dual coverage. The type will be printed on the box or package.

Do you have a fire safety plan?

1. Know how to get out fast if there is a fire.
2. Find two ways out of every room – the door and maybe the window. You might need an escape ladder to get out of upstairs bedroom windows.
3. Children and older people will need help escaping a fire. Plan for this.
4. Know who needs help and pick someone to help them.
5. Make sure windows and doors open easily.
6. Make sure everyone can reach and open locks on doors and windows.
7. Make sure stairs and doorways are never blocked.
8. Practice your plan two times a year with your family.
9. Practice when everyone else is asleep at least once.
10. Have a place to meet in front of your house.
11. Know the Fire Department emergency number. In most towns the number to call is 9-1-1.
13. If there is a fire, get out first, and go to your family meeting place. Then call the Fire Department.
14. Get out and stay out. Never go back inside a burning building.
15. If you have security bars on doors and windows, have a “quick-release” latch. This makes it easy to get outside in an emergency.

Are Alarm Permits Required? YES!

Alarm Permits are required in the City of Lancaster. No person shall operate, cause to be operated, or permit the operation of an alarm system unless a valid permit has been issued by the Alarm Administrator for the system. This requirement is applicable to the person in control of the property, which the alarm system is designed to protect.

An alarm system user or his agent shall obtain a permit for each alarm site.

Upon receipt of a completed application form, the chief shall issue an alarm permit to the applicant unless the applicant has failed to pay a service fee or has had an alarm permit for the alarm site revoked, and the violation causing the revocation has not been corrected.

A permit is valid for one year from the date of issuance, upon receipt of annual fee, unless revoked.

Proper alarm system operation and maintenance is required as to minimize false alarm notifications.

More information regarding Alarm Permits can be found in the City of Lancaster Code of Ordinances Article 4.9000.

Vision

Lancaster Independent School District After-School Program exists to meet the needs of working parents. Our mission is to support the creation of community, providing supervision and enrichment in a safe, structured learning environment. The program is designed to provide academic skills reinforcement and other activities including games, art projects, music, and character development. Tiger Time will be housed at local elementary school campuses.

Elementary After School Care

Beginning Monday, August 23, 2010, LISD will offer an after-school program called Tiger Time on all elementary campuses. Tiger Time hours are from 2:45 until 6:00 pm. Snacks will be provided for the students and Certified Teachers will facilitate the program.

Cost for Elementary Care

Tuition will be \$40 per week for each child in a family who qualifies for free and reduced lunches. A special application must be completed to receive the discount. Tuition for non-qualifying students is \$60 per week. Please note: No family will pay over \$100 per week. Payments Accepted: Cashiers checks and money orders only.

After School Care- Middle School

Beginning Monday, August 23, 2010, Tiger Time will be offered to 6th grade students attending Elsie Robertson Middle School. Hours are from 4:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. Tuition will be \$20 per week for each child in a family who qualifies for free and reduced lunches. A special application must be completed to receive the discount. Tuition for non-qualifying students is \$30 per week. Note: No family will pay over \$100 per week. Snacks will be provided for the students and Certified Teachers will facilitate the program.

City of Lancaster Water Conservation Program

Do's and Don'ts

- Hand water or use a soaker hose. They're permitted at any time.
- Maintain your sprinkler system. Repair any broken, missing, or misdirected sprinkler heads
- Install rain and freeze sensors on your sprinkler system.
- Monitor your total water usage. If you use more than 15,000 gallons a month, you'll pay a surcharge on the amount above 15,000.

-
- Don't water during any form of precipitation.
 - Don't allow your sprinkler system to water driveways, sidewalks, and streets.
 - Don't waste water allowing runoff onto a street or other drainage area when you're watering.
 - Don't water your yard between 10:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. between April 1 and October 31.




