From the Texas Department of Transportation:

One in five crashes involves driver distraction. Drivers who use cell phones in their vehicles have a higher risk of collision than drivers who don't, whether holding the phone or using a hands-free device.

Distracted driving is a dangerous epidemic on America's roadways. In 2016 alone, 3,450 people were killed by distracted driving. During day-light hours, approximately 481,000 drivers are using cell phones while driving. Distraction.gov is your resource for learning more about distracted driving. Get the facts, get involved, and help us keep America's roadways safe.

In 2017, the Texas Legislature passed a statewide ban on using a wireless communications device for electronic messaging while operating a motor vehicle. Texting, as well as reading or writing email, is prohibited while driving in Texas. Many local areas have passed stricter ordinances which completely limit any cell phone use while driving, so it is the responsibility of drivers to learn the laws in their local areas.



The safest policy is to drive now and use your cell phone later. If you must make a phone call or send a text, pull over. Otherwise, wait until you reach your destination to use the phone.

definitions

Part 1 Crime
The F.B.I. chooses these crimes on the basis of their seriousness, frequency of occurrence, pervasiveness in all areas of the country, and likelihood of being reported.

Crime Definitions:
Murder: The willful (non-negligent) killing of one human being by another.

Robbery: The taking or attempting to take anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person or persons by force or threat of force or violence and/or by putting the victim in fear.

Aggravated Assault: An unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe or aggravated bodily injury. This type of assault usually is accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. Simple assaults are excluded.

Burglary: The unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. Attempted forcible entry is included.

Theft: The unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud.

Motor Vehicle Theft: The unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle including attempts.

Sexual Assault: The carnal knowledge of a person through the use or threat of force. Assault to commit forcible sexual assault are also included.

The Seven Step Traffic Stop

Traffic stops are a vital part of an officer's daily responsibilities. They are also the second leading cause of officer deaths in the line of duty. It is necessary for an officer to be able to perform a traffic stop effectively and safely.

During my 17 year career as a police officer, one thing has remained the same. That is the 7 step contact during a traffic stop. Below I will list the steps a police officer takes during a "routine traffic stop"

1. Greeting and Identification: Good afternoon, I'm Chief Urbanski with the Lancaster Police Department.
2. Statement of Violation Committed: The reason you are being stopped is for speeding 45 mph in a posted 30 mph.
3. Request for the driver's Identification: May I see your driver's license and proof of insurance.
4. Statement of Action Being Taken: At this time you are being issued a citation for speeding 45 mph in a posted 30 mph.
5. Take the Action: Issue the citation.
6. Explain the Citation: Explain what actions need to be taken.
7. Closing Contact: Please drive safely.

Although this is only used during routine traffic stops there may be variations to the seven step contact as circumstances dictate.






DON'T GIVE MOSQUITOES A BITING CHANCE

In Texas, mosquito bites are more than just an annoyance. Mosquitoes can transmit diseases that can make you and your family sick. Some mosquito-borne diseases can cause birth defects and others can be fatal. Mosquitoes may become infected when they bite an animal, bird, or person who is infected with a virus or parasite. Infected mosquitoes can then spread the illness to people through bites.

Prevent Mosquito Breeding

Did you know that mosquitoes can breed in as little as a tablespoon of water?

Prevent mosquitoes from breeding on your property by taking these steps:

- At least weekly, empty or remove trash cans, buckets, old tires, pots, plant saucers, and other containers that hold water.
- Keep gutters clear of debris and standing water.
- Remove standing water around structures and from flat roofs.
- Change water in pet dishes daily.
- Rinse and scrub vases and other indoor water containers weekly.
- Change water in wading pools and bird baths several times a week.
- Use mosquito dunks with larvicide for water that can't be emptied or covered.
- Keep backyard pools and hot tubs properly chlorinated and free of debris.
- Cover trash containers.
- Water lawns and gardens carefully so water does not stand for several days.
- Screen rain barrels and openings to water tanks or cisterns.
- Treat front and back door areas of homes with residual insecticides if mosquitoes are abundant nearby.
- If mosquito problems persist, consider pesticide applications for vegetation around the home.

Historic Landmark Preservation Committee

This Committee is composed of five members and one alternate who are appointed to staggered terms by the Planning and Zoning Commission (P&Z) and confirmed by the City Council. Meetings are conducted on the 4th Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. The purpose of the Committee is to become familiar with the buildings, land, areas, and districts within the City that may be eligible for designation as historic landmarks. The Committee serves in an advisory capacity to P&Z.

Parks and Recreation Advisory Board

This board is composed of five members and one alternate serving in an advisory capacity to advise City Council in regards to all matters relating to the City's Parks and Recreation Department, to study the City's parks and recreational programs, and the future acquisition development, enlargement and use policy of the parks and recreation system, including an annual review of the City's Master Parks Plan. Meetings are conducted on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 7:00 p.m.

Storm Water Tips



There is an enormous amount of chemicals and yard waste associated with the spring season. Spring is the season when lawn care professionals and homeowners fertilize lawns to make them more healthy and attractive. While you're improving your yard this spring, you could be harming our environment. Consider the following to protect the quality of our water. Also, encourage your friends and neighbors to do the same.

- **Do Not Over-Fertilize Your Yard:** Over-fertilization will not increase plant growth, but the excess will wash off your yard and down the storm drain, polluting the stormwater. Fertilizers, herbicides, and pesticides, pollute the stormwater and endangers wildlife. Your fertilizer nourishes algae that grows in creeks, lake, and rivers; depleting oxygen in the water, which can kill fish and other aquatic wildlife.
- **Do Not Put Leaves or Grass Clippings into the Storm Drain:** Covered or clogged drains significantly contribute to street and yard flooding. Storm drains are not meant to accept debris or garbage, but to take away overflow rainwater to prevent flooding of home and property.



- **Remember– the Storm Drainage System is Different from the Sanitary Sewer System:** The storm drainage system is a separate system from the sanitary sewer system. Any material that flows into the storm drainage system flows directly to our local rivers and streams, whereas the sanitary sewer system takes wastewater from our homes and businesses and purifies it before returning the water to the river. Please help the City in its fight against stormwater pollution. Whenever it rains, all of the rain water flows to our local rivers and streams, carrying any pollutants that are picked up along the way. We are the solution to stormwater pollution.



WHAT CAN I DO ABOUT STORMWATER?

Water Conservation Tips

Living in Texas means that we are ALWAYS at a watchful level of Water Conservation. The state as a whole remains in a constant state of Water Conservation.



With spring upon us our Water Conservation is currently on "seasonal restrictions" which limits the City residents to landscape watering twice a week from April 1st - October 31st at this time.

City Ordinance allows residents to water twice per week; residents are encouraged to only water as needed.

This watering schedule excludes the hours of 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on any given day (no watering between 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.)

Hand watering and soaker hoses will be permitted at any time.

Simple Steps to

SAVE WATER

Outdoors & In



TEST WITH TRACKS

Water your lawn and landscape only when it is actually needed, such as when footprints are left when you walk across the grass.

AVOID BUZZ CUTS

Cut your grass at the highest recommended height for your turf species or the highest setting on your lawn mower. Cut no more than one-third of the grass length at one time to encourage grass roots to grow deeper.



SPRINKLE WITH CARE

Apply moderate amounts of water to create a healthy, drought- and stress-tolerant lawn. For most Florida soils, applying no more than three-quarters of an inch of water per application is enough to rehydrate the grass. Use spray heads designed for planting beds. Position the sprinkler so that you water only the lawn and shrubs, not paved areas.



OUTDOORS



PLANT FLORIDA-FRIENDLY LAWN

Plant native or drought-tolerant vegetation that thrives in the native soil and local weather conditions. Go native, and resist the urge to water it and just let it go brown during the dry season. It will come back, as nature intended, when the rains come.



FERTILIZE RESPONSIBLY

Excessive nutrients flowing into our waterways do not only come from big industry or agriculture. The use of fertilizer and pesticides on our yards results in pollutants contaminating the waterways in stormwater runoff when it rains. Residents are encouraged not to use fertilizers or pesticides during the warmer months and to use them in the correct amounts during other times of the year.

INDOORS



COLOR YOUR WATER

Detect a leaking toilet by adding a few drops of food coloring to the tank. If the tank is leaking, color will appear in the bowl within 30 minutes. Replace the bad parts or consider upgrading to water-efficient toilets. Avoid flushing the toilet unnecessarily. Dispose of tissues, insects and other such waste in a trash can rather than in the toilet.

NOZZLE THE NOSE OF YOUR HOSE

Equip hoses with automatic shutoff nozzles for car washing, hand watering, etc.



CHECK YOUR WATER METER

Check for leaking pipes by reading your meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is being used. If the readings are different, you have a leak.



TURN IT OFF

Turn off the water while brushing your teeth or shaving.



TIME YOUR SHOWERS

By timing your showers to keep them under five minutes and installing low-flow shower heads, you can save water. The older the shower head, the more water it uses. New low-flow shower heads use only 2 gallons of water per minute or less. Older fixtures use as much as 5 gallons per minute.



LOAD IT UP

Set clothes washing machines that have variable settings for water volume at the minimum amount required per load. If load size cannot be set, operate the washer with full loads only.

Did You Know?

Transportation Code Sec. 545.303
The Texas State Transportation Code States: An operator who stops or parks on a two-way roadway shall do so with the right-hand wheels of the vehicle parallel to and within 18 inches of the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway.



An operator who stops or parks on a one-way roadway shall stop or park the vehicle parallel to the curb or edge of the roadway in the direction of authorized traffic movement with the right-hand wheels within 18 inches of the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway or left-hand wheels within 18 inches of the left-hand curb or edge of the roadway. This subsection does not apply where a local ordinance otherwise regulates stopping or parking on the one-way roadway.

No Parking in Alley




Ordinance No. 2018-02-01

Prohibits parking in any paved alley within the city limits.

"Article 12.500 Parking in Alleys and Streets, Generally
Sec. 12.501 Parking Prohibited

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to leave, stand or park any motor vehicle, boat or other impediment in any paved alley within the city limits.



No Long Term Parking

Code of Ordinances Sec. 22.06.006

No person shall leave standing or park in any public street within the city limits any vehicle, automobile or other character of private property unattended for a longer continuous period of time than twenty-four (24) hours. (2002 Code, Sec. 12.503).

No Parking in Front of Mailboxes

Ordinance No. 2018-02-01

Prohibits parking within certain distances of postal receptacles.

"Article 12.500 Parking in Alleys and Streets, Generally
Sec. 12.501 Parking Prohibited

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person to leave, stand or park any motor vehicle, boat or other impediment upon any public street or alley between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. within fifteen (15) feet of a postal receptacle or a grouping of postal receptacles, except a United States Postal Service vehicle, and except on Sundays and federal holidays."



Any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions or terms of these ordinances shall be subject to the same penalty as provided for in the Code of Ordinances of the City of Lancaster,

Texas, as heretofore amended, and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine not to exceed the sum of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) for each offense; and each and every day such violation shall continue shall be deemed to constitute a separate offense.



Residential Solid Waste

Regular Trash is picked up ONCE a week. All trash must be secured in bags within your **GRAY** cart.



Recycling is picked up ONCE a week with trash pickup. Everything within the **BLUE** cart must be recyclable materials.

If at any time you do not comply within the above mentioned guidelines, your address will be documented as NO PICK UP for that week's collection.

We provide **ASSISTANCE**

If you are physically unable to roll your cart or take your recycling cart to your pickup location, help is available.

Disabled individuals may qualify for a manual trash collection by submitting a manual collection form available at City Hall along with a Doctor's note stating your need for special assistance. This special assistance program allows the driver to get out of the waste truck and pickup the trash/recycling cart from your property without it being placed by the curb.
