









# Adopt-A-Spot Program

- Adopters will agree to a minimum of a **1-year agreement**, renewable upon approval.
- Litter pick-up will be at a minimum of **1 time per month** during the 1 year adoption period. One of the pick-ups must occur on the City of Lancaster's Annual Trash-Off.
- The City of Lancaster will be responsible for supplying trash bags, pick up and disposal of trash bags after each group completes clean up in their adopted area.

If you desire to have additional cart(s) at your residence, visit Utility Billing at Lancaster City Hall 211 N. Henry St, Lancaster TX 75146 or call 972.218.1328.

Cost for additional cart(s):

- One (1) - \$10.00 per month
  - Two (2) - \$15.00 per month
  - Three (3) - \$20.00 per month
- Residents are allowed up to four (4) carts, recycle or trash, at a single residential or commercial property.

Special assistance is available for those who are physically unable to place trash cart(s) out for collection.



# Common Code Violations



**Code Compliance** works in partnership with the people of Lancaster to promote and maintain a safe and desirable living and working environment; to improve the quality of Lancaster's neighborhoods through education, enforcement, and abatement; and to respond to community concerns and attain code compliance while maintaining high professional standards and continually seeking improvements and innovations.

## Parking on Unapproved Surfaces - Ord. 2006-07-24 Section 8.1015 (b) (19)

Parking of vehicles in residential zoned areas shall be on approved surfaces of concrete or asphalt. If your particular subdivision parking pads are primarily gravel surfaces and historically have been used in your subdivision, then gravel is an approved surface if approved by the City of Lancaster Development Code.



## Overhanging Trees and Shrubs- Ord. 2006-07-24 Section 8.1015(f)

It shall be unlawful for any person in control of the property to allow trees and shrubs to hang below 14 feet on roadways or below 7 feet on sidewalks. Failure of the owner to comply with City Ord. shall allow the City of Lancaster to abate the violation at the owner's expense.



# Common Code Violations

## Brush/ Bulk Brush - Ord. 2006-05-16 Section 13.1208

Brush and bulk collection is provided 6 times per year to all residential properties. All brush/bulk should be placed between the curb line and the sidewalk. The maximum amount of bulk brush should be 12 cubic yards. 12 cubic yards is similar to the size of a Volkswagen Beetle. If the amount of bulk brush is more than 12 cubic yards or is blocked by any objects (vehicles, mailboxes, etc.) it will be the owners' responsibility to remove the bulk brush from the property for an additional fee.



## High Weeds and Grass - Ord. 2006-07-24 Section 8.1015 (e)

All premises and exterior property shall be maintained from weeds and grasses in excess of 12 inches, including rights-of-way areas between property lines and the paved street. Where alleys are not paved, it shall be the responsibility to maintain the centerline of the grass alley easement. Any weeds in excess of 48 inches in height will be abated by a City Contractor without notice of violation being sent. If you receive a notice of violation for grass under 48 inches in height, you are allowed 10 days to resolve the violation.

# CWD RESIDENTIAL BULK AND BRUSH COLLECTION SCHEDULE

## Bulky Waste & Brush

Bulky waste will be collected every other month, according to the schedule below.

1 cubic yard is equivalent to approximately one washing machine.



You are limited to 12 cubic yards of bulky waste and brush per collection.

Tree limbs must be placed with trunks parallel to the street without obstructing the sidewalk. Individual items or bundles must weigh less than 50 pounds, and be no longer than 10 feet.

Place all bulk and brush items at your curb no later than 7:00 a.m. on your service day, for collection between 7:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m.

Toys and Yard Tools Tagged as "Bulk Item"

Furniture

Bundled Carpet in 4-foot Lengths

Fence Panels No Larger than 4'x 6'

Thorny Vines Must be Bagged or in Containers

Bagged Leaves (10 Bag Limit)

Washing Machines, Dryers, Water Heaters and Kitchen Appliances

Refrigerators/Freezers  
(Must be tagged certifying removal of refrigerants)


## Bulky Waste - Prohibited

Commercial Remodeling/Construction Debris

Household Hazardous Waste

Tires, Batteries, and Propane Tanks

Loose Household Debris  
(Debris must be placed in a box or other container no larger than 2'x2'x4' and weighing no more than 50 pounds.)

## Residuos Voluminosos y Cepillos

Los residuos voluminosos se recogerán cada dos meses, según el calendario siguiente.


1 yarda cúbica equivale aproximadamente a una lavadora.



Está limitado a 12 yardas cúbicas de desechos voluminosos y maleza por recolección.

Las ramas de los árboles deben colocarse con los troncos paralelos a la calle sin obstruir la acera. Los artículos individuales o paquetes deben pesar menos de 50 libras y no medir más de 10 pies.

Coloque todos los artículos a granel y de maleza en la acera a más tardar a las 7:00 a.m. del día de servicio, para su recolección entre las 7:00 a.m. y las 7:00 p.m.

# REGULAR TRASH & RECYCLING COLLECTION




Regular trash is picked up weekly in the City of Lancaster. The **GRAY** trash carts are designated for regular trash. The new recycling carts are **BLUE**. For residents with ally's, the trash and recycling carts are picked up in the rear of the home.

- For efficient driver retrieval, place both trash (gray) and recycle (blue) carts with handles towards the curb.
- Place carts out by 7:00 a.m for service between 7:00 a.m and 7:00 p.m.
- Household trash should be in disposable bags inside 95-gallon trash carts.
- All items **MUST** be placed in carts.
- Carts must be 3 feet away from each other, 5 feet away from any obstacles: such as mailboxes, cars, fences, gas meters or drainage ditches and a 16-foot clearance above the cart.

## TRASH&RECYCLE

Regular trash and recycle trash are collected ONCE a week. Lancaster is divided into five (5) areas and the day your regular trash is picked up depends on what area you live in. You can view an interactive map that will assist you in determining what day of the week your regular trash is scheduled for collection on our city website.

# Common Permit FAQ



## WHY DO I NEED A PERMIT?

There are many important reasons to obtain building permits and to have inspections performed for your construction projects.



### Protects Property Values

Your home is typically your largest investment. If your construction project does not comply with the building codes, your investment could lose value. If others in your neighborhood make unsafe or substandard changes to their homes, it could lower the resale values for the entire community.

### Saves Money

Homeowners insurance policies may not pay for damages caused by work done without permits and inspections.



### Protects Property Values

Your home is typically your largest investment. If your construction project does not comply with the building codes, your investment could lose value. If others in your neighborhood make unsafe or substandard changes to their homes, it could lower the resale values for the entire community.

### Improves Safety

Your permit allows the building department to inspect for potential hazards and unsafe construction. By ensuring your project meets the minimum building department can reduce the risk of fire, structural collapse and other issues that might result in costly repairs, injuries and even death. Inspections complement the contractors experience and act as a system of checks and balances that can result in a safer project.



### It's the Law

Permits are required by ordinance. Work without a permit may be subject to removal or other costly remedies.



# Common Permit FAQ



## When is a Permit Required?

The following is a list of projects for which a permit is required:

### Construction of a building:

- Main Building
- Accessory building (including permanent and portable storage sheds, gazebos, carports, patio covers).
- Foundation repairs
- Additions to a building
- Remodeling of a building requiring the addition or replacement of walls or windows
- Building or replacing a deck or concrete drives, patios or walkways
- Plumbing work (except for repair or replacement of lines less than one foot in length)
- Water heaters (replacing or adding)
- Water softeners
- Replacing water or sewer lines (repair work such as exchange of washers and faucets is exempt. Also, repair or replacement of lines less than one foot in length do not require a permit)
- Irrigation systems (lawn sprinklers)
- Installing or replacing a furnace
- Installing or replacing an air conditioning system
- Building or replacing a retaining wall over four feet in height measured from the bottom of the footing to the top of the wall.
- Building a swimming pool and repairing it.
- Building a spa (self-contained portable plug-in type spas require an electrical permit)
- Demolition of a building
- Security Bars
- Replacing brick on the outside of a building
- Any modification to the exterior of a building in the Historic District requires a Certificate of Appropriateness. Please see a City Planner for more information.
- Garage Sales - Hold a sale once every six (6) months.



# LANCASTER TEXAS STATE AUXILIARY MUSEUM

The Visitors Center, formerly known as the Interurban building, has welcomed visitors and businesses to our city for over one hundred years. Built in 1911, the Interurban Building was home to the Texas Interurban Railway that ran from Waxahachie through Red Oak, Lancaster, and Dallas to Sherman-Denison until the 1950s.

### Are you eligible?

If you or someone in your household receives federal assistance like SNAP, WIC, Medicaid, a Pell Grant, Section 8 or SSI, you are eligible for ACP. If your income is 200% or less than the Federal Poverty Guidelines or if you receive the Lifeline benefit, you are also eligible. ### LANCASTER EYES & EARS PROGRAM

#### Lancaster Eyes and Ears Program (LEEP)

The City of Lancaster Code Compliance Division is seeking volunteers to join the Lancaster Eyes and Ears program (LEEP)

The LEEP program will primarily perform duties in the field identifying code violations for code officers to perform further investigation. The program is intended to have volunteers aid city staff in improving and preserving the quality of life in our community. LEEP volunteers will help act as the "eyes and ears" in residential and commercial neighborhoods to staff code compliance officers. Citizens are key to identifying potentially serious problems.

#### Essential duties and responsibilities:

Patrol assigned areas to identify code violations such as:

- Excessive accumulation of trash and debris;
- Parking of vehicles, boats, trailers on unimproved surfaces;
- High grass and overgrown weeds/vegetation;
- Junk vehicles;
- Illegal dumping and litter; and
- Illegal placement of signs

LEEP volunteers will be asked to take photos of the identified violation and submit with the address to the code compliance division. The volunteers would only be able to provide limited information to property owners and residents concerning the correction of violations, bulk trash pickup procedures, and adhere to the expectation of privacy and personal safety.

#### Qualifications:

Volunteers are requested to volunteer a minimum of 4 hours per week. Work schedules are flexible based on your availability but are limited to daytime hours. Volunteers must possess a Texas class "C" driver's license, successfully complete a background check and drug test, reside in the City of Lancaster.

#### Training:

The basic training includes, reviewing the relevant municipal code sections, criteria for determining if the conditions and known facts constitute an actual violation and how to work cooperatively with people to avoid confrontation and be a good ambassador for the city. The overall goal is to target, the problem not the people.



Training will include a total of five, 2 hour sessions with code officers to educate volunteers on different code violations that may occur in the field. The training session will include 1 hour inside and 1 hour in the field with a code officer. Volunteers will be trained on what violations are and what they may look like in the field as well as procedures of reporting to code office.





# The Beginning and Legacy of Shady Oak Cemetery in Historic Bear Creek

As new Dallas County communities were being formed during the early years of our County's history, family members mourned the earthly transition of loved ones with an added stress. New settlements lacked burial sites. It is rare today to hear of the start of a new family cemetery. This was once a common solution where families came together to acquire or set aside land to bury their members. Typically, there was an agreement regarding details such as land purchase or donation, retirement of a loan, maintenance of the burial plot, and family member eligibility for burial.

Such was the case in the development of west Irving during the late 1850's when the area was little more than a small settlement of whites and their slaves along the upper reaches of Bear Creek. Here, Minnie Shelton purchased 80 acres of land of which the Shelton family donated a small section for use as a cemetery for slave burials. This area, surrounded by private property, had restricted access for burials. This is Shelton's Bear Creek Cemetery, one of Texas' oldest slave burial sites.

After slavery was abolished in Texas on June 19, 1865, former slaves began moving into the area in west Irving now known as the historic Bear Creek community. The freed slaves did not have a place to bury their loved ones as Shelton's Bear Creek Cemetery was private. Mrs. Dixie Morton Caraway, a life-long resident of the Bear Creek community, tells how her grandfather, Sam Morton, Sam Sweat, and Clarence Trigg often discussed the difficulty faced in finding a final resting place for their loved ones because of the difficulty in gaining access to the private Shelton's Cemetery. She recalls reference to the cemetery as "The Hill".

In the early 1920s, the three men Morton, Sweat, and Trigg, began discussing the need for an accessible cemetery. Mr. Morton suggested that the three of them buy land down the road near their homes at the corner of Compton and Conflans Roads. The men were able to make a down payment, and regular payments until they had fully paid for the land. The testament to their hard work and realization of their dream is the Shady Oak Cemetery.

This brought their three families relief as they would have a place to bury family members long after they were gone. These men decided that a non-family member without a burial place could be buried there upon family approval and the payment of burial expenses. It was not until June of 1933 until they had their first burial, Mary, the wife of Sam Morton.

After the three founders died, the oversight of the cemetery was given to Odessa Trigg King, Clarence Trigg's daughter; Georgia Morton Farrow, daughter of Sam Morton; and Matthew Sweat, son of Sam Sweat. Later improvements to the site included a wall, fence, and gate to surround the cemetery. After conferring with members of the

three families, the West Irving Improvement Association was created to, among other things, care for the cemetery ground needs. Under the leadership of Phillip Wayne Jackson, grandson of Sam Morton, the Improvement Association installed signage bearing the name "Shady Oak Cemetery". Lonnie Green, Jr., nephew of Sam Morton, donated the gate to the cemetery.

Among notable African Americans buried in Shady Oak Cemetery, besides its founders, Mr. Morton, Mr. Sweat, and Mr. Trigg, are the Honorable Jackie Mae Howard Townsell. A business owner in Bear Creek, she was first elected to the Irving City Council in 1977 and served 18 consecutive years until 1995. She is the longest serving person on the City Council; the second woman serving on the City Council; and the first African American to serve on the City Council. An elementary school and the Bear Creek Heritage Center bears her name. Georgia Morton Farrow, the daughter of Sam Morton, who worked tirelessly for a recreation facility for the children of Bear Creek is also buried there. Georgia Farrow Recreation Center at West Park honors her hard work and dedication.

In more recent years, Dorothy Trigg Brewer and Dixie Morton Caraway have overseen maintenance of the ground assisted by Stephen Spruiells and William Trigg, great grandsons of Sam Sweat and Clarence Trigg, respectively. It is their desire when they are no longer among us, that other family members will take over management of this small family cemetery on the corner of Conflans and Compton and properly maintain the grounds in keeping with the dream of Sam Morton, Sam Sweat, and Clarence Trigg!



## Health and hygiene



### PERSONAL HYGIENE

01

Feminine hygiene products, along with wet wipes, paper towels, cotton swabs, hairballs, trash, and debris twist and clump together to create a large wad traveling through the wastewater system that can completely shut down systems!

### FATS, OILS, GREASE

02

Fats, oils, and grease will harden and cling to the insides of your pipes or the city sewer lines. This could cause a sewer backup in either your home or neighborhood.

### MEDICINES

03

If you put medicines such as prescription pharmaceuticals or over-the-counter medications down the drain or in the toilet, they can end up in our water supply.

### CAR WASHING

04

Limit the amount of detergent used. Wash cars in a driveway or yard, not in the street. Direct wash water to pervious areas, like grass or gravel.

### PAINT & PESICIDES

05

The principle of Reduce, Reuse, Recycle reduces excessive use of energy and natural resources. The more efficient and efficient in energy use, the more resources available for other needs.

### PET WASTE

06

Stormwater can pick up pet waste that pet owners leave on the ground and deposit it directly and/or via a storm sewer system into nearby streams, lakes and rivers




